Weaknesses of current system

Transfer system informal; no k3 in west Berkeley; difficult on site registration; Major problem area with Cragmont, Thousand Oaks, Columbus, Franklin;

Issues the Board should consider in making its decision:

Do we have resources to start the change (e.g. Parent center in K-5 model in Cambridge costs annually \$ 315,000 ,what did it cost to set up)?

Will we divert resources to implement changes?

Will we divert staff?

Will we have to hire new staff or consultants to design and or implement the proposed change?

How long can we fund this change and from what identifiable source of funds?

How many years from plan, implementation, to stabilization?

How much disruption will it cause to staff and students? (e.g. how many teachers will have to leave existing schools, how will principles be shifted around, special programs, how will children be transitioned into each change?

Can these changes be implemented along with the proposed physical improvements, what is the down time in each school?

How is the change educationally driven?
